In our ongoing efforts to provide the highest quality of service and comply with security measures in support of our policies pertaining to the war on terror, effective February 1, 2009, the TSA has issued new guidelines. The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) is a division of Homeland Security and has mandated changes for the handling of air cargo listed as follows:

AFC Worldwide Express dba R&L Global Logistics is required to obtain a "consent to screen" authorization from the shipper prior to accepting the shipment from the shipper. The consent must be received from the shipper for all shipments tendered by air. This consent must contain the shipper contact information and could be on any shipping document associated with the shipments or on a blanket notification obtained from the shipper either through soft or hard copy.

Shipments tendered that do not meet the above guidelines may be subject to delay. AFC Worldwide Express dba R&L Global Logistics fully supports the new TSA security measures and we greatly appreciate your cooperation and understanding.

We would also like to take this opportunity to state that AFC Worldwide Express dba R&L Global Logistics is a certified C-TPAT (Customs Trade Partners Against Terrorism) participant. This certification is a result of US Customs reviewing and validating AFC Worldwide Express dba R&L Global Logistics' physical handling of cargo and operational procedures.
